Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Yemen Arab Republic for the Promotion and Protection of Investments signed in Sana'a on 25 February 1982<sup>1</sup> and, in accordance with the provisions of Article 10, to propose that the Agreement shall extend to Hong Kong, the Bailiwicks of Jersey and Guernsey and the Isle of Man.

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Yemen Arab Republic, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and Your Excellency's reply to that effect shall constitute an Agreement between the two Governments which shall enter into force on the date of your reply.

I avail myself of this opportunity to extend to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
